Rector's Letter to the Congregation



Friends,

As I write this, Memorial Day is only a few days past. We are beginning to see the return of some of our summer worshippers. Thanks be to God! It is always a delight to have that extended family present with us. Speaking of summer, it is time for Camp Stoney to begin its summer camps. Each of the four deaneries is responsible for a camp. We are in the Southeast Deanery and our camp is the first week in July. Ours is for high school age children. For a full schedule and information on all the camps, google Camp Stoney or you can go through the Diocese of the Rio Grande website. The theme for the SE Deanery camp is based on Christian themes in

T.H. White's The Once and Future King. Most of the cost of camp is divided among the four deaneries, however we are asked to volunteer some supplies. Each congregation in the deanery will be doing this. As Dean, I am asking ECLC to contribute the items most difficult to mail. Please, help us by contributing: Rolls of plastic sheeting, Spray paint (flat black), Spray paint (metallic colors), swimming noodles (20-30). We also need leather strips & pieces and rags. The things have to be delivered to St. Andrew's, Roswell no later than June 20th. Donna Addison, the youth coordinator at St. Andrew's has designed the camp and will be leading it. She needs to know what will be available & what she will have to purchase. Of course, the biggest need is volunteers. If you would like to volunteer to help or know someone who would,

please speak to me.

Also, if you have children or grandchildren who would like to attend, please let me know.

We will also be having a clean-up day on June 11th. Please, do your best to attend. The recent wind has & continues to deposit pine needles & trash on our grounds. Our session is July 3—9,

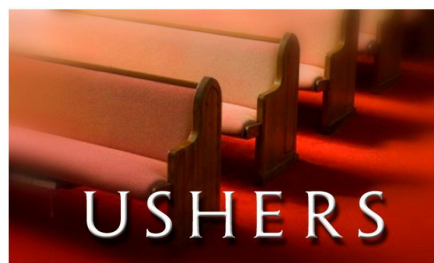


Daughters of the King
